

Providing Opportunities For Community Learning And Supporting People Into Employment

Achievement Through Learning For Adults

Community Based Adult Learning (CBAL)

- 76 classes and workshops ran in 2013/2014 with 599 learners. 82% of learners achieved one or more learning outcomes
- A programme of Gaelic family learning provision was delivered with 68 learners attending. 82% of learners achieved one or more of the intended learning outcomes.

Adult Literacy and Numeracy (ALAN)


- 95 learners attended ALAN provision through the Learning Shop.
 80% of adult literacies learners achieved one or more of their intended learning outcomes.
- Of learners who attended the Learning Shop for core provision, 25 learners received SQA accreditation, 28 learners achieved


employability outcomes, 27 progressed to volunteering and 29 progressed to further learning.

English for Speakers of Other Languages (ESOL)

- 30 learners attended ESOL learning at the Learning Shop. 80% of ESOL learners achieved at least one or more of their intended learning outcomes. Four learners received SQA accreditation; 16 learners achieved employability outcomes; six learners progressed to volunteering; and, 16 learners progressed to further learning.
- The Learning Shop delivered a Citizenship: Preparation for Life in the UK test course. All those who have sat the test subsequent to attending the 12 week class have passed.

Achievement Through Learning For Young People

"Generic Youth Work

- Five young people trained as Youth Legacy Ambassadors.
- Seven Young people completed a HiFires course in Lewis, Nine completed a HiFires course in Harris and ten have completed a HiFires course in Uist.
- A programme of diversionary activities was completed in Barra with 40 young people taking part and 53 young people also took part in a summer holiday programme.
- The Uist Holiday Club ran during the Easter and Summer holidays and a Gaelic Residential was delivered in Locheil for nine young people from Oigridh Uibhist
- At the Duke of Edinburgh's Awards Ceremony in November 17 full bronze awards, 16 full silver awards; three full gold awards were presented along with 25 bronze section certificates, 16 silver section certificates and 14 gold section certificates.


Pointers Youth Café & Outreach


- A core group of 11 attended the Young Mums group,
- A core group of six attended the Young Carers group.
- A core group of eight attended the Pointers Girls group and they are completing their Bronze Youth Achievement Award.

- A core group of seven attended the Pointers Boys Group and they are working on the Dynamic Youth Award.
- There was a core group of seven young peole on the Pointers Youth Committee and during the year there have been 1589 attendances at Pointers Café Drop In provision.

Youth Work in Schools

- The Employability class in the Nicolson Institute continued to be supported with 10 pupils participating during the year. There were also 15 pupils taking part in the SQA Rural Skills course in the Nicolson Institute working towards John Muir Award and D of E Award.
- Alcohol & Education workshops in the Nicolson Institute were delivered to 177 53 pupils
- A new Duke of Edinburgh's Award Group has commenced in Sgoil Lionacleit
- Lifestyle' workshops for S5 S6 pupils in Castlebay School in consultation with Guidance Teachers have been completed.
- Weekly sessions delivered in Sir E Scott School to assist the development of community and school links.
- Pupils in Barvas and Sir E Scott Schools were participating in the locally developed Edge Award with four Sections completed by P1-P3 pupils and two sections by P4-P7 pupils.

Achievement Through Building Community Capacity

Youth Democracy

- The Lewis and Harris Youth Engagement Conference was attended by 65 young people and the Uist and Barra Conference was attended by 45 young people.
- Over 350 young people from throughout the Western Isles engaged in a Youth Consultation with the findings used to plan the Youth Conferences and development of Youth Council priorities
- Barra Youth Council focussed on an All Weather pitch, a Mobile phone survey and fundraising events.
- Priorities for Youth Councils include Referendum on Independence; and Improving Wifi, Internet and 3G.
- Uist Youth Voice and Barra Youth Council visited the Scottish Parliament and sat in on First Ministers Question Time. They also met MSPs to discuss the Referendum on Independence and inter island flights and ferries
- The Western Isles Scottish Youth Parliament Member continues to be supported.

 2,842 Young Scot NEC cardholders in the Western Isles, representing 71% of 11-26 year olds.


Community Groups and Events Supported


- Supported WIDEA Committee to administer a LEADER project.

Other Capacity Building

- Introduction to DofE training delivered to six Leaders in Uist and First Aid Remote Expedition training delivered to eight Leaders in Lewis. Youth Leader Training delivered to 10 people.
- CLD Learning Community groups undertaking Community Needs Analysis.
- Barra DofE group established.
- Adult Protection training to Adult Education Workers and Volunteers and CLD peer learning sessions were delivered regarding CLD Regulation, Prevention and Early Intervention and CLD roles within Partnerships.

Training Programme Delivery

Scottish Qualifications Authority (SQA) Approved Centre

- The Accredited Training & Skills Team gained accreditation in SVQ Certification in Work Readiness and Introduction in Work Place Skills
- All candidates participating in Level 1 Manufaturing Textiles Training achieved the target qualification
- 40 staff have been supported to undertake SVQs (four at Level 2, 32 at Level 3 and four at Level 4). 13 staff have completed their target SVQ (one at Level 2, 11 at Level 3 and one at Level 4).
- Residential Care staff registration is up to date and PVG registration process is underway for Home Care staff in preparation for registration.

Modern Apprenticeships

Thirty new Modern Apprentices have started this year and twenty one completers achieved their target qualification.

Employability Fund


Sixty five participants have been recruited onto the new Employability Fund programme this year. Of the fifty leavers to date thirty eight have achieved a positive outcome

Hebridean Independent Living and Learning Service (HILLS)

The revised HILLS Service was successfully introduced in January 2014. Full time trainees have moved onto the joint College project and the Failte Café project is supported by the Learning Shop.

Outer Hebrides - Managing Employment, Enterprise and Training (OHMEET)

Funding for OHMEET has been confirmed on an ongoing basis and six leavers achieved positive outcomes.
