Pension Credits

Pension Credits gives you extra money to help with living costs if you're over State Pension age and on a low income. It can also give you access to:

- The Winter Fuel Payment
- Warm Home Discount Scheme & Cold Weather Payment
- Housing Benefit/ Support for mortgage Interest
- Council tax discount
- A free tv licence if aged 75 or over
- Help with NHS dental treatment, glasses and transport costs for health appointments
