Please provide an overview of the policy including the key aims and expected outcomes:

The policy relates to a rezoning of the catchment boundaries for lochdar and Daliburgh Schools specifically affecting communities in the Middle District of South Uist. The townships of Stoneybridge, North Stoneybridge, Ormiclete, Peninerine and Snishival are currently within the catchment of lochdar School and the consultation will consider whether they should remain there or transfer to the catchment of Daliburgh School.

Detail the budget implication relating to the policy:

There are no budget implications relating to consultation on the proposal but there will be financial implications relating to school transport should the policy be adopted. This results from existing school bus contracts for Daliburgh School requiring to be extended to operate to the northern-most point of the revised catchment area as Snishival. An equivalent adjustment will be required for the southern-most point for school transport to lochdar School. Detailed costings for these changes will be calculated should the Comhairle decide to move to full statutory consultation in April 2025.

What will change as a result of this policy?

If the full policy is adopted, the townships of Stoneybridge, North Stoneybridge, Ormiclete, Peninerine and Snishival will be added to the catchment of Daliburgh School, thus removing them from the lochdar School catchment. This results in the catchment boundary between the two school moving approximately 2.6 miles (4.3km) further north. Maps are available showing the consultation area.
