5	Matters arising	There were no matters arising that were not on the agenda to be discussed later

7	Harris Forum update	All members of the Forum have been asked to look at the proposed changes to the constitution. MMI will check if having a bank account will have any negative impact on CEF and will e mail round once she has an answer. 8	Luskentyre Parking	There was a meeting on Monday 29 th January with representatives from the CC, David MacLeod (CNES), Cllr Paul Finnegan, Joan MacLeod and Lynne MacKay. Agnes Morrison attended on behalf of NHCC and she explained that

		the Council had proposed lining the carpark next to the cemetery and dedicating a number of spaces for use by cemetery users only. The number of spaces was increased to 5/6 with one disabled space, at the request of Lynne MacKay. The Council had also suggested wording for signage to go at the entrance to the carpark. Joan MacLeod and Lynne MacKay had asked for some changes to this – The sign had ‘Welcome to Luskentyre’ on it and ‘Enjoy your time in this beautiful place’ and they have asked for this to be removed. The Council have agreed. DMD thanked AM for attending this meeting and it is hoped this has now reached a conclusion.

12	Correspondence	Tarbert in Bloom had written to tell the CC a bit about themselves and their vision for the Village. They are two local ladies who have plans to spruce up Tarbert with plants etc and to look at getting a company in to deal with the trees in Tarbert. It was agreed that this is a worthwhile project and the CC would like to support them. More information is required and DMD and GMD will arrange to meet with them to discuss further	DMD & GMD
