AM has photos which she will forward to PF. He has had no joy with the request for a speed limit from Ardhasaig to Tarbert, the Police are not prepared to budge on this. Cameron Morrison has said he will continue to campaign about this. Extra Bins – the council will not put in any extra public bins Residents Parking in Tarbert – he will talk to technical services regarding this, this has been set up in Scalpay and he cannot see why it would not be set up elsewhere. Campervan Parking at Rally Park – the residents in this area do not seem to feel there is a problem however if the CC feel there should be something done he will speak to the council. 	AM

It was thought by those present that this is at the discretion of the driver but JML asked if it was a Council policy so AM will ask the Cllrs to check. JML was also asked by a member of the public if there could be white lines put on the single track roads to aid reversing in the dark .
