South Uist Primary Schools Catchment Area Rezoning

- 10 It was agreed to recommend that the Comhairle:
 - (1) note the findings of the preliminary consultation and consider the options detailed at paragraph 6.5 of the Report; and
 - (2) agree to take no further action and retain the current catchment areas.

National Thematic Inspection of Education Authorities

11 It was agreed to recommend that the Comhairle note the Report and support the Central Education Team in the development of the Action Plan to address development areas, particularly where they relate to strategic governance and elected member engagement.

Stornoway Primary Sports Development Update

It was agreed to recommend that the Comhairle note the Report, including the increase in the total project cost which will be met from external grant funding.

The Promise: Supportive School Structure (Right to Education) Project

13 It was agreed to recommend that the Comhairle:

- (1) note the progress of The Promise Project innovations in the Nicolson Institute, Extended Learning Resource and several feeder primary schools; and
- (2) support the continuation of the project for the 2025-26 financial year based on the use of external funding streams referenced in the Report.

Outer Hebrides Bairns' Hoose (An Taigh-Sholais) Project

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It was agreed to recommend that the Comhairle note the progress made with An Taigh—Sholais and the achievements to-date across the workforce for designing a Bairns' Hoose model that has achieved national and international interest and supported the Comhairle in achieving all 11 Standards.

Continuing Care Policy and Allowance

15 It was agreed to recommend that the Comhairle agree:

- (1) the payment of a maintenance allowance for young people in continuing care who reach the age of 18 at the rate of £200.00 per week and that the rate will be paid up to the young adult's 21st birthday if they remain in the continuing care placement;
- (2) that the rate of allowance will increase in percentage terms at the same rate at the recommended national foster care allowance; and
- (3) that for young people studying or training and having to live away from their Continuing Care placements, the carers will get a pro rata payment for when the young person returns to their Continuing Care placement (during holidays and visits between holidays), that an additional weeks' payment will be made each academic/training term to carers to use in a way that benefits the young person, and that with prior agreement from social work, young people will have the costs associated with their travel to and from their Continuing Care placement covered.

Barra and Vatersay Community Campus Update

16 * It was agreed to recommend, insofar as the interests of the Committee were concerned, that the Comhairle:

- (1) notes the advice and professional assessments contained in the Report and the Developed Study; and
- (2) agrees that the Chief Executive, in consultation with the Elected Members of the Project Board, implements the operational and political strategies set out in paragraphs 2.3 and 5.7-5.10 of the Report.
