This proposal aims to save £43,000 per annum by reducing the budget across three external providers at a rate of 5% reduction. This equates to a saving of 1.1% of the total budget.

External providers are responsible for delivering services to children and their families on behalf of the Children and Families Social Work service. A reduction in the budget for external provision may reduce the level of service that is provided on behalf of the Comhairle.

- The budget will be reduced by 1.1%, which is £43k.
- This proposal will reduce the budget to external providers by 5%. As discussion has not yet taken place with these providers, it is not yet clear whether there would be potential impacts on service users. It is unlikely that services would be withdrawn or significantly changed on the back of a 5% reduction, but further assessment will be required to fully understand the impact of this proposal.
