This budget saving proposal outlines the non-replacement of four secondary school posts, streamlining the curriculum delivery and reducing the subject choices in the Senior Phase. This is expected to achieve savings of £200k which is 3.6% of the budget available for this section within the Education, Skills and Children's Services Department.

There was early discussion with the Local Negotiating Committee on the potential for increasing digitalisation and harmonising timetables which could increase subject choice but, to date, this has been ruled out by the Trade Unions.

It is not clear at this early stage which subjects may be reduced as this will depend on vacant posts.

### Detail the budget implication relating to the policy:

This proposal aims to save £200,000 per annum. This equates to a saving of 3.6% of the total budget.

### What will change as a result of this policy?

This proposal means reducing the subject choices available to pupils in the senior phase.

Senior phase pupils will be impacted if there is a reduction in subject choices available.

#### Comments

- The Budget Strategy is strategic with an aim of saving over £1.7million in 2023-24. This level of saving obviously has some impact on service delivery. This proposal aims to save £200k.
- This is likely to reduce the subject choices available to pupils in the senior phase of their time in school. It is unclear at this stage which subject choices will be impacted by the non-replacement of staff.
- This proposal sets out to reduce the staffing complement with non-replacement of some posts within secondary schools.
- The budget will be reduced by 3.6%, which is £200k.
- There are likely to be changes to the service with a reduction in the subject choices available to senior phase pupils.
- This budget reduction is likely to have an impact on senior pupils if the subject choices are reduced.

It is too early to say exactly what the impact is likely to be – as it depends on the subjects that are reduced and whether pupils are given options to access courses via digital means. Although this is likely to be upsetting for pupils, this should not have a detrimental impact on career options as universities/colleges take into account subject access for pupils when deciding on offering places.

This is likely to require close review and monitoring and early discussion with pupils and parents when it is clear what subject choices will be reduced.
