



ROAD TRAFFIC REGULATION ACT 1984

COMHAIRLE NAN EILEAN SIAR

(ASSAYE PLACE, STORNOWAY) (PROHIBITION OF DRIVING – EXCEPT FOR ACCESS) ORDER 2023

Comhairle nan Eilean Siar proposes to make the “Comhairle nan Eilean Siar (Assaye Place, Stornoway) (Prohibition of Driving- Except For Access) Order 2023 under the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984.

The effect of the Order will be to prohibit any person from driving or causing or permitting to be driven, any motor vehicles from Willowglen Road in an easterly direction through Assaye Place. Access will be available for residents and vehicles servicing properties on Assaye Place.

The Order is intended to prevent Assaye Place being used as a through-road from Willowglen Road to Macaulay Road. Access will still be available in a westerly direction from Macaulay Rd through to Willowglen Rd.

The Order will replace the previous Experimental Order which ran for 13 months.

Full details of these proposals are in the Draft Order which, together with a map showing the length of the road affected and a statement of the Comhairle’s reasons for proposing to make the Order may be examined on the “Roads” section of the Comhairle’s website at <https://cne-siar.gov.uk/> .
