#### Please provide an overview of the policy including the key aims and expected outcomes:

The Draft Corporate Strategy has been refreshed following a Members Seminar and public and partner consultation. It has 4 strategic priorities and 20 strategic outcomes and it aims to progress over the period from 2024-2027.

The revised priorities are: Strengthen the local economy; Support children, families and young people; Support caring and resilient communities and quality of life; and Deliver community leadership.

A Suite of KPIs has been collated to provide a consistent basis for the Comhairle to assess if the outcomes of people in the Western Isles are improving over time and support data-driven decision making.

#### Detail the budget implication relating to the policy:

There is no specific budget associated with this strategy. Delivery of the strategic outcomes detailed within the Corporate Strategy will be dependent on financial resources available via the Scottish Government's revenue and capital grants, and additional funding sourced for delivery of key projects.

#### What will change as a result of this policy?

This draft Strategy sets out the strategic direction for the Comhairle and for the key services delivered by the Comhairle. It is anticipated that there will be progress in the key areas set out in the strategic outcomes.
