









# TYPICAL MASONRY HEADWALL CULVERT INLET & DISCHARGE (1:25@A1)



## TYPICAL SECTION THROUGH ACCESS TRACK (1:10 @ A1)







#### PROJECT DESCRIPTION

Scottish Water require a new access which maintenance teams can use to safely transport materials and equipment to and from the Tarbert Water Treatment Works (WTW) reservoir. The reservoir is on a priority for list for cleaning, but the existing track is unsuitable due to its steep gradient which makes it unsafe for vehicles to access.

#### SITE DESCRIPTION

The existing Tarbert WTW (Grid refence NG196986) is located approximately 4.5km east of Tarbert and 2.5km north west of Scalpay. The site takes access from an unnamed single carriageway road.

The site of the proposed works is an area of rocky grassland, which increases in height from south to north towards the reservoir. There is a limited amount of flood risk according to SEPA Flood Risk Mapping. The site is within the South Lewis, Harris and North Uist National Scenic Area. There are no built environment designations within or adjacent to the site. There is also no woodland on the site or core paths. There are no residential dwellings within or adjacent to the site of the proposed development. There is an existing access track to the west of the WTW connecting to the reservoir, however this route is very steep and unsuitable for vehicular access.

PROPOSED DEVELOPMENT

The access track will connect the WTW to the reservoir, primarily travelling along the east side of

the WTW. The proposed track will not directly connect to any public roads and will be formed off

parts of existing track adjacent to the WTW and reservoir. The proposed access will have a total

length of 465m and a width of 2.5m. The route will be formed of a 75mm layer of crushed

aggregate stone. A single field gate will also be installed towards the northern end of the track.

The new access will begin approximately 100m east of the WTW, at approximately 57m above

sea level. The track will finish approximately 450m north of the WTW, rising to a maximum height

of 114m.

**PLANNING POLICY**

PLANNING ASSESSMENT

Principle of Development

NPF4 Policy 29 Rural Development encourages rural economic activity, innovation and

diversification. Development proposals that contribute to the viability, sustainability and diversity

of rural communities and local rural economy will be supported, including essential infrastructure.

Policy 18 Infrastructure First of NPF4 does not specifically refer to water treatment works,

however the intention of this policy is to encourage, promote and facilitate an infrastructure first

approach to land use planning, which puts infrastructure at the heart of placemaking. Policy EI9

Transport Infrastructure of the OHLDP supports proposals for improved infrastructure, on the

basis that it would not detract from the character of the area.

The proposal seeks to form a new track to provide safer access to the Tarbert WTW reservoir.

The track is essential to enable key waterworks operations and maintenance to be carried out as

the current access is unsuitable. The principle of an access track in this location is considered to

be acceptable given there is an existing track of a similar length and width on the opposite side

of the route of the proposed development. The proposed access is in keeping with the character

of the area, which is an established WTW and associated infrastructure. The proposal is therefore

considered to comply with NPF4 Policy 18 and OHLDP Policy EI9 and is acceptable in principle.

Landscape

The proposed works are within the South Lewis, Harris and North Uist National Scenic Area.

Policy 4 Natural Places of NPF4 only supports development affecting a Scenic Area (NSA) if the

objectives of the designation are not compromised or any significant adverse effects on the

designation are clearly outweighed by social, environmental or economic benefits of national

importance. Policy NBH1 Landscape of the OHLDP 2018 only permits development affecting a

National Scenic Area under similar circumstances outlined previously in NPF4 Policy 4.

The proposed access track will be located on an area of steep land and will not be highly visible

from public viewpoints. The development will not require a significant amount of engineering

works and will be built into the natural topography of the landscape. Overall, due to the design,

scale and layout of the proposed access track, it would not have adverse effect on the character

of the landscape or South Lewis, Harris and North Uist NSA. The proposal is therefore considered

SW Internal General to comply with NPF4 Policy 4 and OHLDP 2018 Policy NBH1.

Natural Heritage

NPF4 Policy 3 Biodiversity seeks to protect biodiversity and deliver positive effects from

development and strengthen nature networks. OHLDP 2018 Policy NBH2 Natural Heritage

similarly seeks to protect the outstanding natural heritage of the Outer Hebrides.

There are no national or international nature designations affecting the site. Given the remote

context of the site however and the potential for impacts on local wildlife due to the length of the

access, an ecological survey will be carried out to assess the impact of the development on the

natural environment and inform any necessary mitigation during the construction phase. The

proposal is therefore considered to comply with NPF4 Policy 3 and OHLDP 2018 Policy NBH2.

<u>Archaeology</u>

NPF4 Policy 7 Historic Assets and Places and OHLDP 2018 Policy NBH5 Archaeology seeks to

protect and enhance historic environment assets and places.

There are no identified built heritage designations within or adjacent to the application site. Due

to the required ground works and potential impact on archaeological remains, an archaeological

survey will be carried out to ensure any assets are protected and mitigation provided where

necessary. The proposal therefore is considered to comply with NPF4 policy 7 and OHLDP Policy

NBH5.

Layout, siting and design

NPF4 Policy 14 Design, quality and place requires development proposals to improve the quality

of an area whether in urban or rural locations and regardless of scale. OHLDP 2018 Policy PD1

Placemaking and design requires development proposal to demonstrate a satisfactory quality of

place-making, siting scale and design that respects and reflects local characteristics and the

surrounding built and natural environment.

The proposed access track is of an appropriate scale and design for the character of the area,

with a maximum width of approximately 2.5m connecting an existing WTW and reservoir. The

access has been designed taking into account the natural topography of the land and therefore

would not have a significant visual impact on the wider landscape. The access track will be formed

SW Internal General of crushed aggregate material and is suitable for the context of the area. The development will improve the quality of the area by creating a safe access to the reservoir, allowing operations and maintenance to be carried out safely which is currently not possible using the existing track. Overall, the proposal is considered to comply with NPF4 Policy 14 and OHLDP 2018 Policy PD1.

#### CONCLUSION

Under Section 25 of the Town and Country Planning (Scotland) Act 1997, the proposed development stands to be determined against the policies contained within Outer Hebrides Local Development Plan 2018 and National Planning Framework 4, unless material considerations indicate otherwise. The relevant planning policies have been assessed and it is considered that the proposed development is compliant with all applicable policies. The planning application is submitted with supporting information in the form of site plans, section drawings, and technical specification. The proposed development would ensure safe access to the WTW and reservoir, whilst being mindful of the existing landscape character and minimising any impacts on this.
