This would subsequently result in a reduction in the number of Gaelic events as well as a reduction in opportunities for the use of Gaelic in the community. It could have an impact on the local economy that relies on Gaelic events/posts. However, attempts will be made to bridge the gap in funding by increasing Gaelic grant income to the Comhairle.

#### What will change as a result of this policy?

There will be reduced resource for dispersing funds to community groups applying to the small Gaelic grants budget for events/projects related to youth, community and inter-generational sharing of the language.
